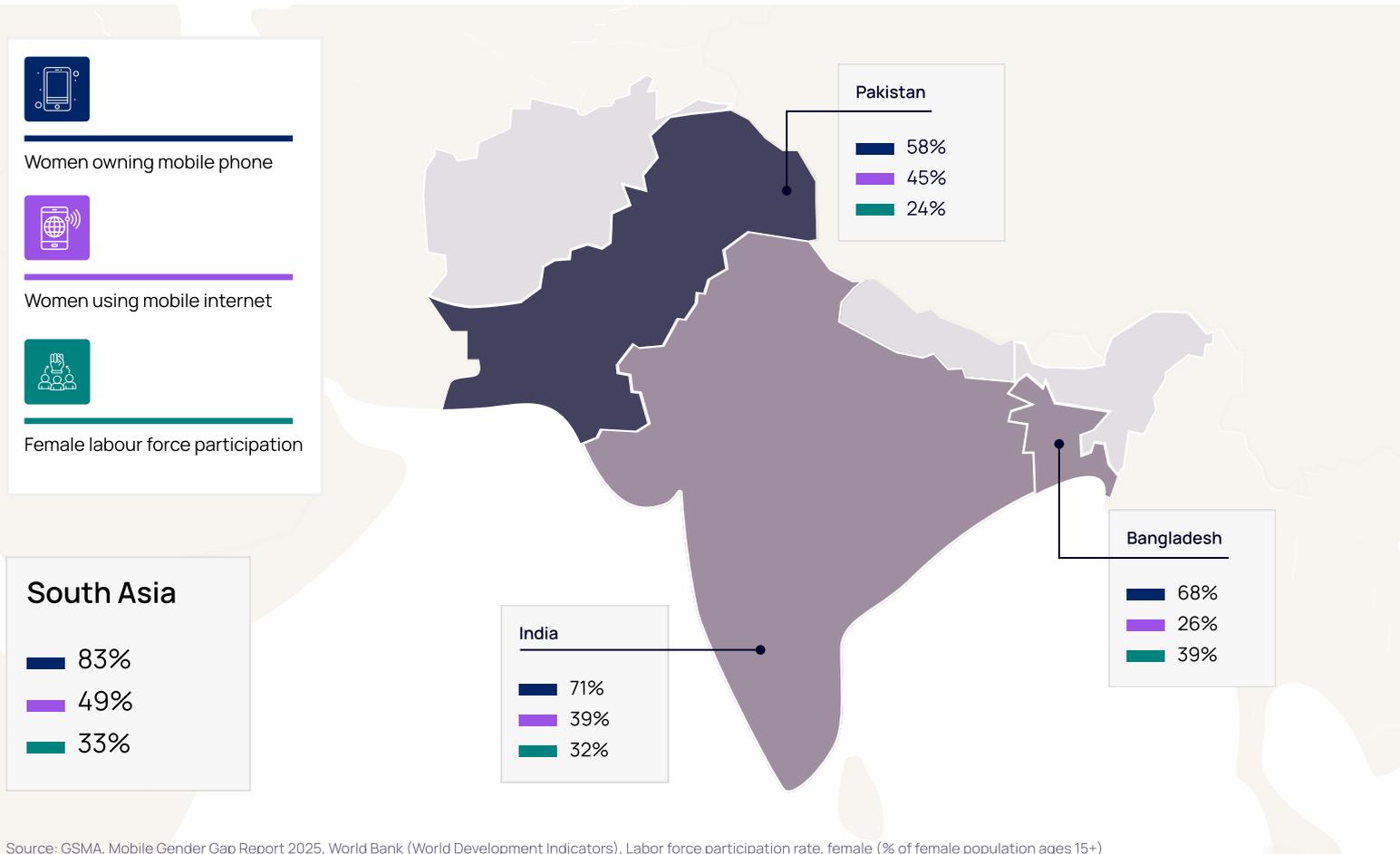


# From Access to Agency:

How do Women Navigate Technology and Work in Pakistan?

## 01 Series Introduction

Mobile internet usage by Pakistani women is amongst the highest in the region, yet female labour force participation continues to dwindle. “From Access to Agency” unpacks women’s patterns of mobile usage and the lived realities of workforce participation.



### What does this series present?



**Technology insights** from survey evidence, to map gendered patterns in mobile access, ownership, digital use-cases, online interactions, identity management, and safety.



**Workforce participation insights** from qualitative data, illustrating women’s resilience and motivation to enter work in small-towns where social influence and mobility shape their pathways.

## Limitations

- The research studies were designed to generate exploratory and illustrative identification of key themes.
- The sampling for the studies was not statistically representative; findings point to areas for scaled-up research with representative sampling to generate definitive results.
- Categories less than 2% have been omitted for clarity.
